As requested in the House Report (111-181) accompanying the Agriculture Appropriations Act, 2010, the Department of Agriculture (USDA), in consultation with the Acting Administrator of the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), submits to the Committees on Appropriations this report on the status of local and regional food aid procurement projects. The projects were authorized by section 3206 of the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008. This report summarizes the use of fiscal year (FY) 2009 funds and planned activities using FY 2010 funding.

The enclosed table lists the local and regional procurement projects funded during FY 2009. As of December 1, 2009, no purchases have been made under project awards, which were announced in late September 2009.

Interim guidelines for submitting proposals were announced in a Federal Register notice on September 21, 2009, which also invited organizations to submit applications for program funding. In October 2009, USDA held an information session on the guidelines for potential applicants. Project proposals will be accepted until at least June 2011. USDA is planning to provide its funding decision on each proposal shortly after submission. As of December 11, 2009, USDA had not received any proposals for funding during FY 2010.

Similar letters are being sent to Senator Kohl, Congresswoman DeLauro, and Congressman Kingston.
